## **Editorial Note**

The order of the five texts that make up the presented issue devoted to Paul Ricœur's philosophy harmonizes with the title. If the first two texts (Robert Grzywacz, Ricœurian Philosophy of Life and the Question of the Fundamental – a Final Concession in Favour of Immediacy? and Jarosław Jakubowski, The Question "Who am I, so inconstant, that notwithstanding you count on me?" as the Focus of Ricœur's Existential Philosophy) pertain to existential themes, the last two (Maria Cristina Clorinda Vendra, Paul Ricœur on Social Imagination. Across Tradition And Innovation and Ernst Wolff, Ricœur and the Philosophy of Technology) deal with social issues. The third text (Krystyna Bembennek, "Passive Preservation" – Ricœur's Understanding of Phronesis in the Context of the Renewal of Tradition), which in a way bridges the first two and the other two texts, addresses both existential and social issues.

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
